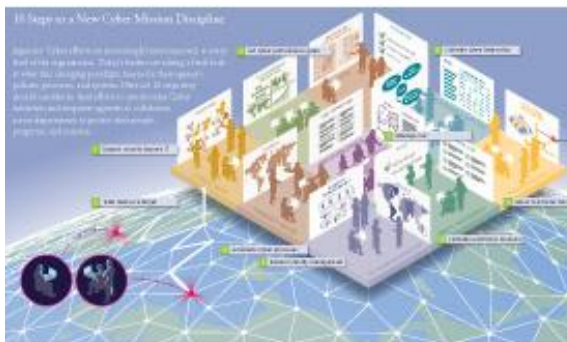

Our October 19<sup>th</sup> meeting exposed us to new ideas and had some eye openers. We had over 60 attendees at Waterview Conference Center on the 24<sup>th</sup> floor of the Deloitte building in Rosslyn. More people found the parking garage entrances and exits (all on 19<sup>th</sup> street - but not at the Hotel Palomar), and it truly cost only \$5 after 5 pm! There are still some bargains in the world.

We enjoyed another fine reception, with scallops and bruschetta, drinks, and conversation.

We welcomed several new members to the meeting and hope that they will continue to join us in the future!

### Operation Homefront

This month's charity speaker was Kellie Boyle, Director of Development at Operation Homefront. She touched us with stories of how the organization has helped our servicemembers, family members, and veterans overcome the emergencies in their lives by providing gift cards for food and other necessities or paying for essential bills when a family cannot. Operation Homefront will be working the Army 10-Miler on 24 October, and Kelli solicited volunteers to help – and left

with a large list of eager participants.

But what most of us didn't realize was that, after the 1990 Exxon Valdez spill, Congress enacted the Oil Pollution Act of 1990, which set up the Oil Spill Liability Trust Fund – funded until about 6 years ago by a 5 cent a barrel oil tax. This \$1.5 billion fund helped to pay for some of the damage the spill caused. Cmdr Harker was in charge of the accounting out of the Unified Area Command Center in New Orleans, which monitored cleanup – and he set about billing BP for recoverable costs (which went back into the trust fund), as well as direct costs for which the USCG was reimbursed. The trust fund also paid private organizations and reimbursed the National Guard for some of its response efforts. A good news story is that BP had a 4-day turnaround in paying their bills! As a part of this year's USCG financial statements, Cmdr Harker's team had to perform internal control testing and verify billings, as well as send out confirmations a few days before fiscal yearend to other Federal, State, and Local agencies on what work they had completed but not been reimbursed for – and he had a 100 percent response rate! This was definitely an enlightening evening!

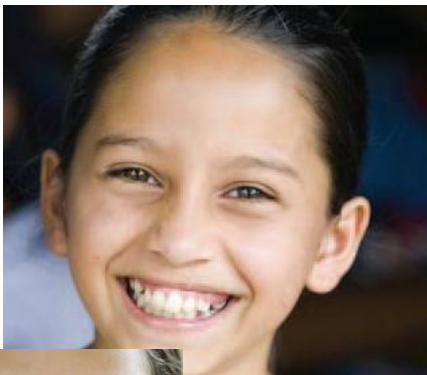


# Operation Smile

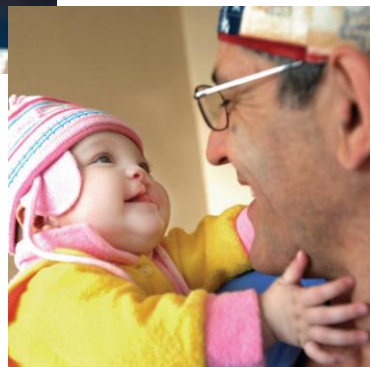
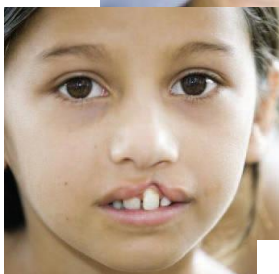
Changing Lives One **Smile** at a Time
